# Continuing Professional Development Report

## Kristy Newson, Toronto April 6 & 7

- National currently only has one reviewer trained to review MainPro accreditation for medical marijuana CME. Discussion around if medical marijuana still needed a separate review process or if current reviewers could be reviewing these programs. The NCCPD approved inclusion of the review of cannabis education programs in the CFPC standard Mainpro+ program certification process.
  - Discussion around auditing MainPro + activities for members. Currently there is no formal audit in place to review MainPro + activity submissions. The NCCPD committee approved a process of credit entry verification based on randomly audited CPD activity submissions as opposed to a direct audit on members.
- program evaluation form: “This program content enhanced my knowledge” and “Please indicate which CanMEDS-FM Roles you felt were addressed during this educational activity”
- The NCCPD approved that Royal College Section 3 credits as equivalent to Mainpro+ certified
  - Assessment credits at a 1:1 ratio. Family physicians may claim up to 50 Royal College credits per cycle. **Our chapter will need a new CPD representative.**

# *Improving Access of Local Food for Lower Income Diabetic Patients*

Dr. Shannon Curtis and Dr. Katherine Bell

- Small feasibility study
- 30 patients living with diabetes who will be provided access to free fresh fruits and vegetables for six months next winter
- Outcomes: produce consumption, HbA1c, weight as well as participant feedback (qualitative)
- Leveraging funding from Dept of Fisheries and Agriculture for innovative food security programs
- Status: awaiting funding and ethics approval
